Transesophageal Echocardiography Image Acquisition - The Basics for CRNAs
Presenter: Mark Ritter, CRNA, MSNA

Objectives: describe the care and inspection of the TEE probe; list the indications and contraindications for using TEE; discuss the various axes created by the multiplane probe; discuss the basic views obtainable with the multiplane probe; discuss the images seen under color Doppler interrogation; consider the overall hemodynamic status of the patient when images are interpreted by the cardiologist.

Depth of Anesthesia and Poor Outcomes: Correlation or no correlation?

Preoperative assessment for the Non-Cardiac Surgical Patient

This talk will review the current guidelines for assessing the patient going to surgery for a non-cardiac procedure. We will review specific cardiac diseases, diagnostic work up and management considerations to deliver a safe surgical outcome.

Preoperative Assessment for the Non-Cardiac Surgical Patient
Presenter: Louann Bailey, DNP, APRN, FAANP

Objectives: Verbalize fire triangle components; List 3 examples for each side of the fire triangle; State which OR team member is responsible for each side of fire triangle; Describe which patients are at risk for a surgical fire and an airway fire; State measures anesthesia providers should implement to prevent an airway fire and surgical fire.

Blood and Massive Transfusion: A Review

Presenter: Kathleen Massoli, CRNA, DNP

Objectives: List the antigens and antibodies present in the various ABO blood types; List the order of preference for emergency blood transfusion; Describe the biochemical changes that occur during blood storage; Define massive transfusion and associated complications/coagulopathies; List the most common cause/signs of a hemolytic transfusion reaction; Discuss measures implemented to prevent acute renal failure associated with a hemolytic transfusion reaction; List infections transmitted with blood products.

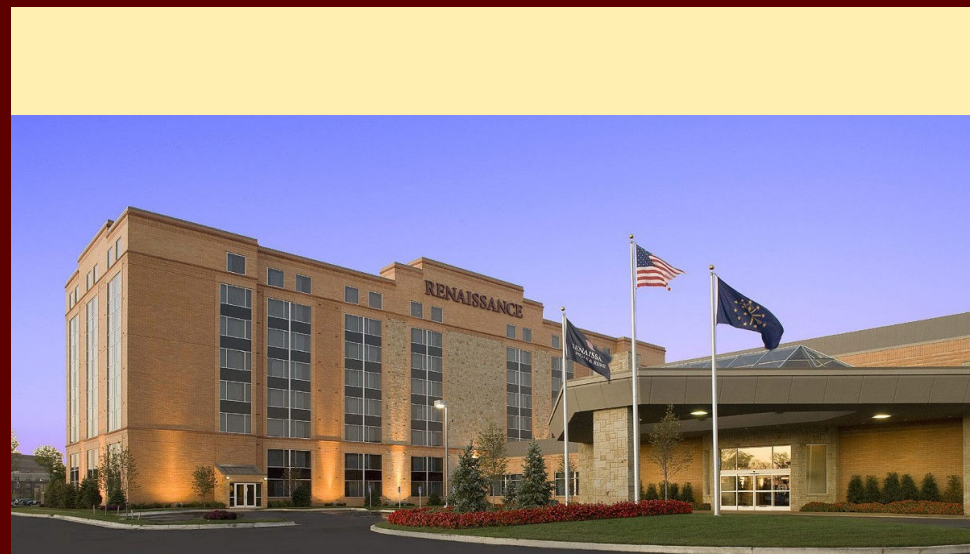
